MS. CIESLAK: Mr. Chairman, I apologize for the interruption. This is Cindy Cieslak. I missed - Rebecca Simonsen, Trustee is also in attendance.

CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: The Chairman's Report will be certainly brief, but important. The Comptroller's Office RSD continues to use their technology appropriately and improving it. There is new talent being hired in two positions, and the folks who are replacing them, the retirees are helping to train. So kudos to Marty Carlson and the office.

Marty, do you have anything to add, please?

MS. CARLSON: I do, and it's actually a point of personal privilege. You all know that we have a new comptroller, Sean Scanlon, coming into office on January 4<sup>th</sup>. What most of you don't know is I have known him since he was in the fifth grade. He graduated from high school with my son, and I've been mentoring him through his political career since he got out of college.

He will be awesome. He is brilliant, ambitious, and eager to serve the members that we take care of and the citizens of the State. That being said, I will also announce that this is my last Retirement Commission meeting. I will not be the deputy under Sean Scanlon. I have been in the office

for 26 years. I've been really, really lucky. I think I'm probably the longest surviving political appointee in the history of Connecticut politics, but I've been really lucky to work under Nancy Wyman and then Kevin Lembo.

until February 1<sup>st</sup>. I'm determined both substantively and emotionally to finish Kevin's term. So I will be done on January 4<sup>th</sup>, and I am really excited to tell you that the new Deputy Comptroller will be Tara Downes. She and I have worked side-by-side for 12 years under Kevin Lembo. She is a brilliant mechanic and public policy strategist, so I think you'll all enjoy working with her. And I'm thankful for all the service. I am honored to have worked with all of you. I think we've done amazing stuff in the last 12 years and taken very good care not only of the members and the Retirement System, but the taxpayers of the State of Connecticut as well in a fiduciary sense.

So sayonara. Thank you for all your support over the years, and I'm sure I'm going to see most of you. I will tell you that, like a bad penny, I'm not going anywhere. I will be coming back as a TWR to finish the migration of the CORE-CT system, which is the State's essential central financial system, to the

cloud. So you've probably heard the name Angelo 1 2 Romano. He is also retired, and he and I will spend 3 the next year or so finishing that project. So, Tara, why don't you say hi? 4 MS. DOWNS: Hi, everybody. I have 5 encountered many of you along the way (inaudible) the 6 7 Comptroller's Office for about 12 years, and I have a lot to learn, but thankfully, Marty has been the best 8 mentor that anybody could ever ask for. I am so 9 grateful for her. And I'm also grateful that she's 10 11 going to be close by and Deputy Emeritus for me and helping me because I have a big learning curve. 12 But I look forward to working with all of 13 you, and thank you, Marty, for everything, you know, 14 15 you've done for everybody along the way. CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: Thank you, Marty. 16 Thank 17 you, Tara. Okay. (Inaudible) 18 19 MR. FLORES: Great job, Marty. 20 CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: I'm sorry. 21 MR. FLORES: I really appreciate everything, the guidance you've given through these meetings, the 22 23 small number of ones that I've attended. But you're

always a wealth of knowledge, so you're definitely

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being missed.

I won't be as missed, but I am also leaving State service. I told the - this was back in the summer. I told Treasurer Wooden that my four years - you know, I would finish this term, but that would be it. So I told the new Treasurer-Elect I'll help with the transition, but whenever he tells me goodbye, it will be goodbye. So I don't know if I'll see you at the next meeting or not. But I just wanted everyone to know.

CHAIRMANA ADOMEIT: Well, thank you, John. You too will be missed.

Okay. Well, moving on to John Herrington.

MR. HERRINGTON: I'm not certain how I follow all of that, but typically the December meeting was a happy meeting. But I guess there's quite a number of goodbyes.

What I would say is I definitely kind of appreciate the guidance, both of Marty with respect to the Commission meetings, but largely with operations of the divisions. She's made my transition into this role, you know, much, much easier. And she's definitely been supportive of all of the initiatives as we try to move the Division in a new direction.

So, Marty, you will definitely missed. And, Tara, I look forward to continuing to work with you.

And, John, as with your remarks to Marty, I think that, you know, in the number of Commission meetings that you've attended, I've always been kind of pleasantly surprised by the, you know, practical insights that you've added on some matters.

So all of this is allowing us to kind of continue in this transition period in terms of dealing with, as the Chairman stated, some transitions from retirements and bringing on new employees. We continue to hire new employees. We hope by the end of the month that we'll have, you know, maybe as many as seven new employees joining us.

In terms of some of the other items, one item that remains outstanding is the SERS reemployment regulation. That's something that we continue to receive a number of inquires from potentially impacted

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     members. That process is moving through the process,
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     but it looks like it may be January or so before we
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     have resolution. Hopefully we'll be able to report
     next meeting that we have some resolution to that
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     issue.
