- 3 No. 1, VCP update.
- 4 MR. BARTH: We need to go in executive
- 5 session.
- 6 MR. ADOMEIT: We do. Thank you.
- 7 MS. CIESLAK: Peter, there is an approval
- 8 of the agenda on the -- there's an item titled
- 9 Approval of Agenda on the agenda.
- 10 MR. ADOMEIT: Oh, I don't see it, but

- MR. COFFEY: I'll so move.
- 14 MR. LUCIANO: I'll second it. I don't see

- 17 Opposed nay. The ayes have it. We're in executive

- MR. BARTH: That moved the agenda. Now we

- 9 MR. COFFEY: Yes.
- MR. LUCIANO: Yes.

- 12 from 8:39 a.m. until 9:06 a.m.).
- MR. ADOMEIT: We're out of executive
- 14 session.
- 15 MR. BARTH: Is there a recommendation that
- 16 the Committee would like to make to the Commission
- 17 regarding the de minimis amounts for VCP?
- MS. CIESLAK: I'll just remind everyone
- 19 that I turned the recording back on. Please state
- 20 your name when you make a motion or make a
- 21 statement.
- 22 MR. BARTH: That was Bruce Barth. Sorry,
- 23 Cindy.
- MS. CIESLAK: Thank you.
- MR. ADOMEIT: Any comments?

- 1 MR: HERRINGTON: I do think perhaps not for
- 2 this particular situation, but for, you know, future
- 3 use by the Division across the board that there would
- 4 be some benefit for there being a, you know, rule
- 5 that applies equally to both under and overpayments
- 6 with respect to de minimis amounts, whatever that
- 7 should be.
- 8 MR. LUCIANO: I would like to make a
- 9 recommendation to the Board that the de minimis
- 10 amount, both for collecting and paying, be a hundred
- 11 dollars for the VCP and other issues. I'm not sure
- 12 that we can -- we can make a motion to do that, but
- 13 I think we can make a motion for the Board to do
- 14 that. I think as a subcommittee the Board still has
- 15 the authority, so I would make that as a
- 16 recommendation.
- 17 MR. CAREY: I think that makes sense.
- 18 Cindy, didn't you say that there's
- 19 something in one of the regulations already about a
- 20 hundred dollars?
- 21 MS. CIESLAK: Yes. The overpayment
- 22 regulation is 5-156c-1 and it does say de minimis
- 23 amounts of a hundred dollars or less may not be
- 24 collected.
- 25 MR. CAREY: That's consistent with

- 1 existing regulation, so Sal, I think your
- 2 recommendation is terrific. I think we should move
- 3 forward with that.
- 4 MR. COFFEY: My only concern with the
- 5 motion is we heard from John that there really
- 6 wasn't much of an administrative burden when it came
- 7 to paying people out the money. If that's the case,
- 8 then I don't know whether we have to -- we really
- 9 have to deal with this at this time, and that maybe
- 10 we could wait until we come up with situations that
- 11 are not so de minimis, or not so unburdensome, I
- 12 should say. I'm willing to go along with the motion
- 13 if the other trustees feel that now is the time to
- 14 move forward with this.
- 15 MR. ADOMEIT: Okay. Do we have that as a
- 16 formal recommendation or should we just present it
- 17 to the Commission?
- 18 MR. HERRINGTON: I think it should be a
- 19 formal recommendation.
- MR. ADOMEIT: Okay.
- 21 MS. CIESLAK: I do believe Mr. Luciano has
- 22 moved to make that recommendation.
- MR. LUCIANO: Yes.
- 24 MR. ADOMEIT: Is there a second?
- 25 MR. CAREY: Cindy, you can consider my

Page 6 comments as a second. 1 2 MR. ADOMEIT: All right. Any further 3 discussion? Hearing none, all in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It's unanimous. The ayes have it. 4 5 All right. We have come to the end of the line, I believe. Have we not? 6 MR. LUCIANO: I believe a motion to 7 8 adjourn is in order and so moved. MR. CAREY: I'll second. 9 10 MR.
