Okay. Thank you. My Chairman's Report will be similar to many that you've heard, and that is basically a shoutout to the Division and to folks that are doing the work behind the scenes to make this stuff work. It's truly been an extraordinary journey with the virus, and it's been an extraordinary response by all of the people who make the system work.

Division Director's Report? You're muted.

MR. HERRINGTON: Sorry about that. Before you, you have this month's Director's Report. I would say that I echo kind of Peter's sentiments in terms of the efforts being made by all of the staff within the RSD. I would say, you know, that COVID was one thing; the preparations for 2022 are something completely different. We have quite a bit of work that we need to get through, and our best chance of success is to kind of evaluate some of our processes, find as many ways

possible that we can kind of do prework, complete cases as early as possible based on the best information that we have possible.

We're trying to find synergies and efficiencies across the different divisions within the Office of the State Comptroller. Our hope - right now, we really are in a very good position, and so long as we receive applications at least 30 days prior to any individual's retirement date, we're confident that we can place people on the payroll with no interruptions in benefits whatsoever. The X factor is the extent to which applications are going to be submitted to this division timely.

In terms of the work that we've done, you will see that the retirements continue to be heavy historically. I mean, in most years, February is a relatively light month. We had a number of retirements this past month. We had 268. Again, there was only one month last year that had retirements at that level. So even in what we would expect to be a relatively down month, we had a great deal of activity.

What you'll see in that Roman numeral III is our best efforts to kind of keep track of this population and get ahead of the population as best as possible. So what we do is we receive intents to

retire from individuals and we process the retirement paperwork. We process the record as though we had received a completed retirement package. And as you can see, right now, there projects to be 2,200 retirements just in these first six months with 877 applications for April, intents for April. Right now, we've worked through over half of that number. So we're just about complete with March now and we're about halfway through the Aprils that we have in-house now.

So if that number doesn't necessarily double and we still have, you know, six to eight weeks to work through the April figure, we're in good shape. But to illustrate the point, although we're working on these individuals, just about 900 that have submitted intents to retire, we actually only have six actual retirement applications in-house. So we continue to think of ways to - it's most important that we have the intent to retire because that allows us to do a lot of our work. It would be better if we had the applications received earlier in the process. We continue to have meetings and discussions with the DAS pods so that hopefully we can find some efficiencies there so that we can get more of these applications in earlier.

But so long as individuals provide those

intents to retire and the applications come in on time, our plan seems to be working. In terms of some of the regular work, we are up to speed and keeping pace with disabilities, so I think that was definitely worth the while for us to put in the effort over the past year to put that behind us.

But that's basically where we stand as a division going forward.

CHAIRPERSON ADOMEIT: Thank you, John. Any comments or questions? Okay, hearing none, Marty Carlson.

MS. CARLSON: Good morning, everybody. I just want echo or/and elaborate a little bit on what John was talking about and that, you know, notwithstanding the unbelievable effort by John's staff to get this data cleaned up. It was a brilliant idea to take the letters of intent and clean up all the data so when the application comes in, it's just a matter of processing it through the calculator with some exceptions.

The other thing I also want to echo is almost every single staff member in the Comptroller's Office has a finger on this retirement surge. We've crosstrained people. You know, it's one thing to calculate the pension; it's another thing to get it into payroll.

And that is a process that we were worried about significantly and have become less worried about because they have managed to put some technology in place that will make that transition a little easier, we hope.

Am I right, John?

MR. HERRINGTON: Correct.

MS. CARLSON: And then secondarily - finally, my laser focus throughout this whole process has been, you know, we use technology, you know, exquisitely in the Comptroller's Office. There are thousands of members that are in - State employees that don't have access to the technology or don't know to use the technology. We have - you know, these folks, you know, could probably send 25 photos on their iPhone to their sister in California but don't know how to log onto a webinar, maybe don't even have a personal computer at home; they're working on, you know, a Kindle or an iPad.

So we've been having - John and I have been having discussions. We think that the two main cohorts are Carl Chisem's union and Angel, this is what I want to talk to you about for the DOC as well, to find out the best way to reach them and to help them. In Carl's case, what has been happening to him is that some of

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his maintainers, you know, in DOT or wherever are
