much. The Chairman's Report will be very simple and very direct. The challenges of the increase in applications for retirement have been successfully met, I think, by the Division. And I just wanted to congratulate them on working on all of these applications in a timely fashion.

Division Director's Report.

MR. HERRINGTON: Good morning, everyone.

This is John Herrington. Yes, the influx of retirements certainly is occupying, you know, the bulk of the Division's resources in recent months. We are at the point where we can kind of see the end of the tunnel, but there is still quite a bit of work out there. Right now, it projects that we will have just about 700 retirements in June to process and at least

1,100, perhaps, you know, something closer to 1,200 to 1,400 for July. We continue to make all of the preparations that we can to have that work done so that everyone should be in a position to seamlessly transition to retirement with no interruption of benefits.

At the same time, we continue to deal with the, you know, substantial kind of losses on our own staff. I believe Marty has kind of reported on this in previous months, that, you know, we, in the Comptroller's Office as a whole, but also within the Retirement Division, we have our own retirements. But we have been able to work with DAS and OPM to get a number of those key individuals hired back as reemployed retirees. So that is helpful, but we do have some substantial losses.

Among the most notable would be, Colin Newman has elected to retire July 1st. He's also generously offered to come back as a reemployed retiree, but, you know, that is going to be a large loss to the Division. And also Annette Sadlowski, who kind of spearheads all of the work for our disability retirements. She is retiring June 1st. So those are some really kind of substantial departures that we need to deal with.

But all in all, the Division has done a great

job getting prepared for all of this work and making these transitions going forward.

CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: Thank you.

Marty Carlson, do you have anything to add, please?

MS. CARLSON: Yeah, I do. And I know we constantly are talking about getting the audits done.

John's staff is, as he said is - the letters of intent we have, we are working on even before we get the application, and I think that's part of the reason, combined with the technology, that we're in the place that we're in.

all of these people on payroll. A couple of years ago, we moved (inaudible) the payroll over to Mark Bissoni, who was the Division Director of Active Payroll and he now runs both payrolls to great efficiency because, you know, the tasks are very aligned. I do want to give him a shout-out, not about retirement. He actually helped - worked with John to develop a better streamlined way, not only to get all of the final audited applicants onto payroll, but also to automate their health benefits and move them to where they need to be.
