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     on the fact that these are extraordinary circumstances
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     and that it's a situation where a request was made for
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     some information on the matter that was not addressed
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     properly. Our recommendation is unique to this
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     situation and this situation alone. Any other matter
     must be looked at in terms of the individual facts of
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     that case. This is not to serve as a precedent for
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future matters.

MR. COFFEY: Cindy or John, if you think there's any tweaking of that that needs to be made, it's welcome here.

One thing that I might add as a suggested amendment is to note clearly that while it is not our practice to permit individuals to change their type of retirement, we have looked at these circumstances. So just to be clear that it is not our practice to do such, but under these individual circumstances, we have agreed to do so.

MR. COFFEY: I accept that.

CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: I'm going to - do you want to read it back to us, Cindy?

MS. CIESLAK: I have that Mr. Coffey moved to recommend to the Commission to approve the request of Cathy Wilson, however this decision is based on the fact that these are extraordinary circumstances where the information was requested and not addressed properly, and that these facts are unique to the situation and the decision does not serve as precedent; other similar requests should be looked at on their

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     facts; and Michael Carey suggests in addition to
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     include that it is not the Commission's ordinary
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     practice to permit individuals to change their type of
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     retirement.
                CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: Does that cover the
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     waterfront?
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                MR. COFFEY: I believe so.
                CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: All in favor of the
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     motion, raise your hand or say aye.
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                UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKERS: Aye.
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                CHAIRMAN ADOMEIT: Opposed, nay or say nay.
